WOW! LOOK WHAT THEY DID!

In the last Newsletter I used this phrase about the wonderful new hospital building at Malappuram, Dr. Sophia and friends produced by their own efforts. I also reported that they needed some help in purchasing an ultrasound scanner. Lo and behold, donors came forward to meet this need. So now I have to use the same words to describe our MMS donors: Wow! Look what they did!

As I look ahead in India I see some negative pressures emerging. By that I mean some difficulties have come together in an unusual combination. The sociopolitical climate is less than favorable since May, so some of our public activities may have to be modified. Inflation is running so high that there is a problem making rupees stretch. The core group of our workers is rather elderly and we have to find some younger staff. As the population increases, the harvest fields are getting bigger and MMS is looking at new ways to do the reaping. Still, the Lord blesses us bountifully. The photos from Anantapur illustrate how that extensive movement to Christ is still going on.

The blessing of the Lord is real right here in Canada as well as in Malabar and beyond. Last month while in the States on a speaking mission, I met a young Lutheran pastor from a Gujarati Muslim background with a Tanzanian connection. Now he is shepherding a rural congregation. In the city where I spoke there is now a small fellowship of Somali believers. That is quite extraordinary. I also met an Arab Lutheran Pastor who was born in Jerusalem. Rev. Abdul Masih ("Servant of the Messiah") is vigorously church-planting in Dearborn, Michigan. I marveled at how the Spirit, the Primary Reaper, is working.

We also need to continue working hard in Malabar while it is day. Please do not forget to pray for and support that outreach this season. I hope to give another WOW! next time.

I also enjoyed a meal in the homes of Rev. I. Titus (MMS Agent) and Mr. C. D. Solomon (MMS Accountant). They accompanied me on all my travels.

Gospel workers expressed heartfelt appreciation for the support MMS gives them, financially and prayerfully, in their evangelistic activities. I felt honored to extend MMS greetings to them, as well as the assurance of our continued support at least through the year 2017. Administratively, the India Evangelical Lutheran Church continues to struggle with internal conflicts. The situation is similar to the one 24 years ago that led to the founding of MMS! Hence, our "reason for being" is still valid. See our mission statement under the heading of this newsletter.

In all my annual visits to India I am impressed and inspired that in MMC's local congregations, the witness of the Church is still vibrant and effective. Laypeople and pastors make friends with their non-Christian neighbors and share the Gospel with them through personal conversations, house prayers and other outreach events such as Vacation Bible School. They do so even in the face of persecution and discrimination. They are edified, encouraged and equipped in their witness through regular worship and home devotions, which include singing Christian hymns to indigenous melodies from memory. Please continue to pray for the believers in Malabar and beyond.

HERE IS HOW THE PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY MMS ARE ADVANCING



April, as the hot dry season begins, is the month for **Vacation Bible Schools**. A total of 20 VBS camps were held in the MMC with a total 921 attendees: 409 were Christians, 455 were Hindus and 57 were Muslims. Rev. A. T. Baby, pastor in Sulthan Bathery, had the most camps and highest attendance: VBS camps in five locations with a total of 312 children. He also had the largest number of Hindus: 212. Rev. T. Joseph, pastor in Kozhikode, had the largest number of Muslim attendees: 27 in two locations. The church in Meenangadi served by Reverend Satheesh had the largest number of Christians in attendance: 165. VBS held at Christ, Wandur, by Rev. S. S. Oliver had only Christians attending. The VBSes held in Sharathkunnu (Evangelist C. D. Solomon) and Kozhikode had only Hindus and Muslims attending. Evangelists Devaraj and Richard and Rev. Joseph led VBS sessions in new locations where they have not been held before. May God bless the Gospel seeds planted in the hearts and lives of these children, so that they yield a bountiful harvest in their families and communities.

MMC workers reported the following results from their ministries:

- Vadattupara (Pastor Devaraj): one baptism and two confirmations
- Wandur (Rev. S. S. Oliver): two adult baptisms and 12 confirmations
- Kozhikode (Rev. T. Joseph): one person preparing for adult baptism
- Two new families are worshiping in Moolenkavu (Rev. A. T. Baby) and three new members are worshiping in Chooralmala (Evangelist Richard).

Rev. Raju reported that his congregation, Immanuel Lutheran Church, Mundakutty, is raising funds to build a **new church building**. Ladies in the congregation are making soap as a fund-raising project. They request help from MMS for this challenging undertaking.

The **Youth Camp** sponsored by MMS in Sulthan Bathery, 2-3 October 2014, had a record 81 participants. The presenters posed the questions "How can we serve God at our young age?" and "Who will go to the Harvest that is waiting?" A woman psychologist explored the topics of drugs and alcohol and their influence on society as well as Christian identity.

The **Family Convention** on 7-8 November 2014 also had a record number of participants: 173. The event took place in a newly constructed community hall built by the congregation members and Rev. Baby in Sulthan Bathery. The theme was "Let anyone with ears listen!" In addition to the main speaker there were smaller group meetings for youth, women and men, and a Bible quiz.

Computerizing the **Bible Correspondence Course** (BCC) is moving forward thanks to our technical consultants in India, Tony Jose and Samuel John. Mrs. Lillian Saar has graciously provided a major gift for this project in memory of her husband, Art Saar. We invite our readers and supporters to visit http://

and see the preliminary design of the website. The English version of the BCC on the book of Isaiah, written by Rev. Dr. Roland Miller, is available for download. Consider enrolling in the course yourself, then recommending it to your unchurched friends. Samuel John and Rev. Dr. D. Christudas have done the translation into Malayalam. It is being proofread now. The Malayalam BCCs that have been used in Malabar are being retyped in a format suitable for computer downloading. They are based on the four Gospels and a special course for a Muslim audience called "The Promises of God." We will also add the English versions of those courses. Eventually all of them will be available online for downloading.

Students using the courses in Malayalam can download and print the materials, fill in the answers by hand and either scan the completed lessons and email them back to the

instructor OR mail the completed lessons through the postal system. Students taking the courses in English will be able to do so interactively on computer using Word or PDF formats. We hope this will revitalize the BCC ministry in Malabar and stimulate more interest, especially among younger people. Please pray that the study of God's Word will create faith through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Our prayer request for the **English as a Spoken Language** program at the Otten English School in Wandur on 12-24 October 2015 is that at least three more teachers will volunteer to join our team. The Otten English School has an enrollment of more than a thousand students in kindergarten through grade 12. Most of them are Muslims. The faculty numbers more than fifty teachers. They all teach in English, but want to improve their speaking and teaching skills, so the ESL course is designed primarily for them.

God has blessed us with a **new worker** in the Malabar Mission Circle at Bethel Lutheran Church, Naduvil, and Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Chengalai. He is **Rev. S. Resalayyan.** He reached retirement age in August 2014, after 38 years of ministry as a pastor in the India Evangelical Lutheran Church. He was able to "take duty" in October 2014. These congregations are new mission starts initiated by MMS around ten years ago. The church and attached parsonage have received needed new roofs. Enrollment at the nursery school in Naduvil has increased. We welcome Rev. and Mrs. Resalayyan in Jesus' name and pray for many years of joyful ministry in this mission field.

The Gospel for Muslim Salvation and Welfare Association of Anantapur hosted a **Muslim Converts Meeting** on 21 August 2014. More than 70 people attended! The six testimonials included one from a man miraculously healed and two from doctors (one government and one from a private clinic). Rev. Shaik Ismail, the leader of this phenomenal movement, encouraged these new believers by comparing the Bible and the Qur'an, and Jesus and Muhammad. They also conducted three adult baptisms of new converts in September and five in October 2014. Besides the spiritual encouragement and support this meeting gives, it also

creates a venue where families of converts can meet each other to arrange marriages for their sons and daughters, since converts are often ostracized by their families. The event was funded by MMS.

PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD
